**Mobility rate** is based on the number of times students enroll in or leave a school during the school year.

**Chronic truants** are students who are absent from school without valid cause for 18 or more of the last 180 school days.

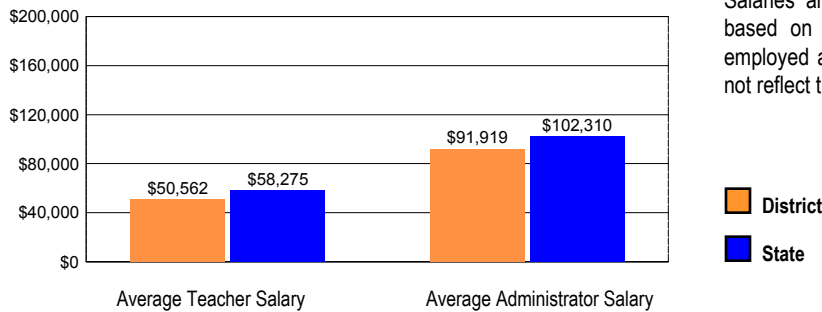

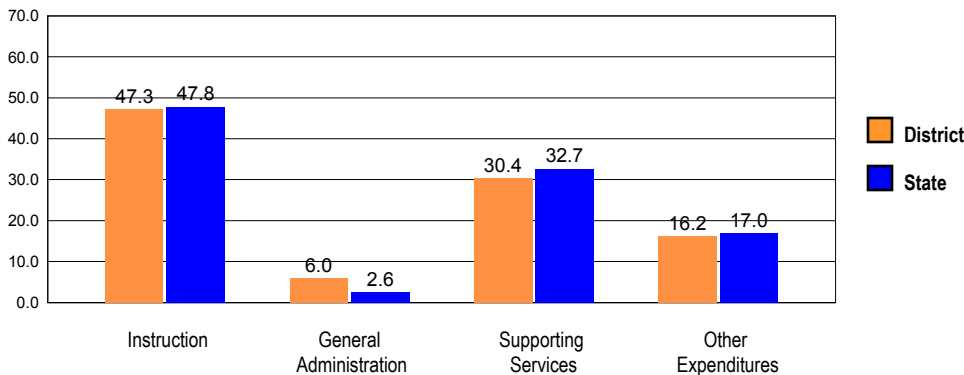
## SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCES

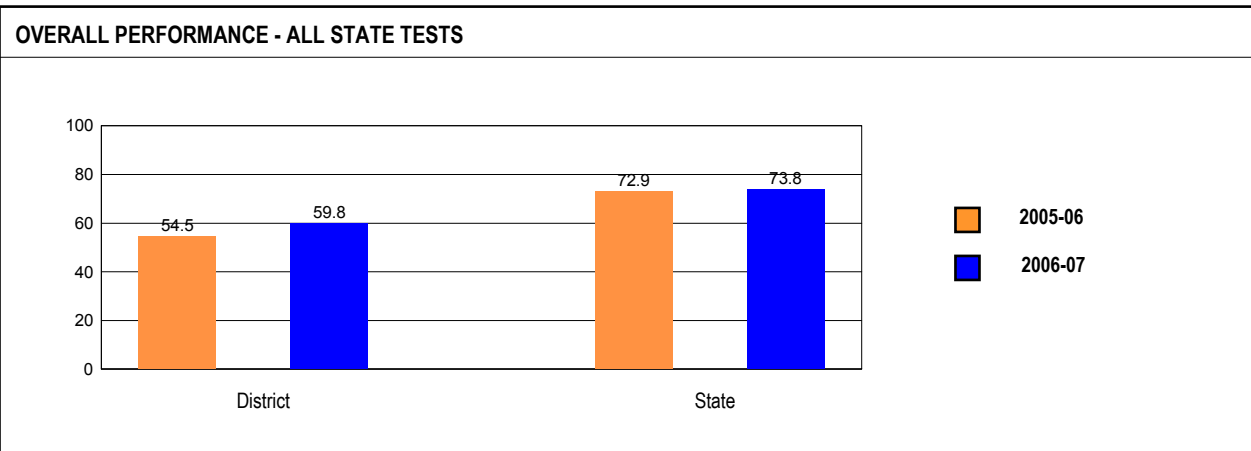

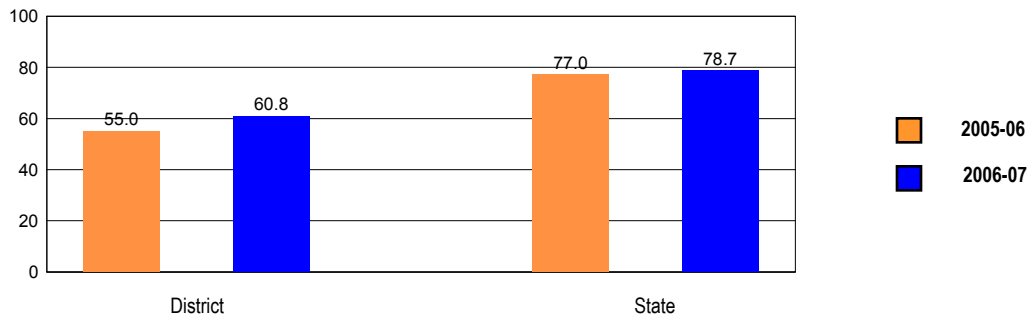

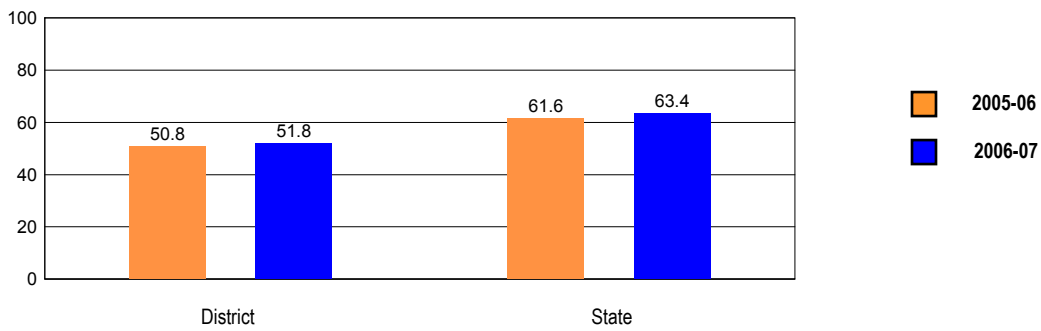

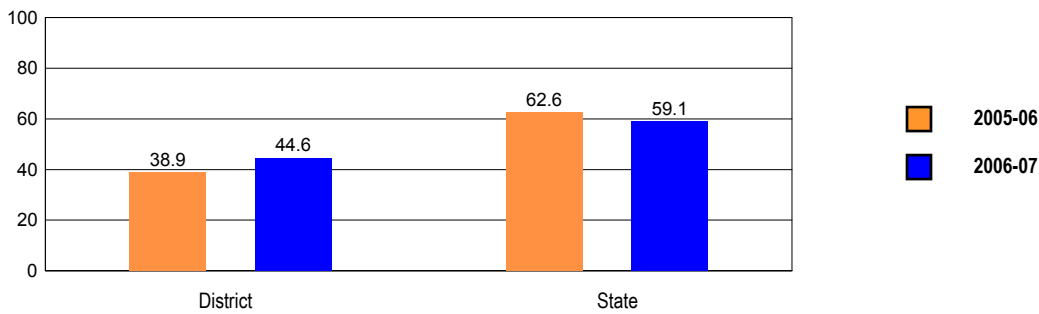
**OVERALL ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) PERFORMANCE**

**OVERALL ILLINOIS ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT (IAA) PERFORMANCE**

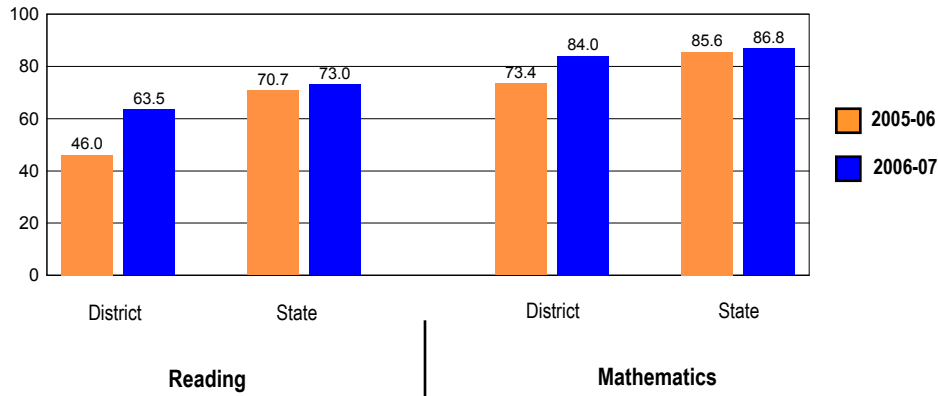


IAA scores in the Progressing and Attaining performance levels count the same, respectively, as scores on other state assessments that meet or exceed Standards.

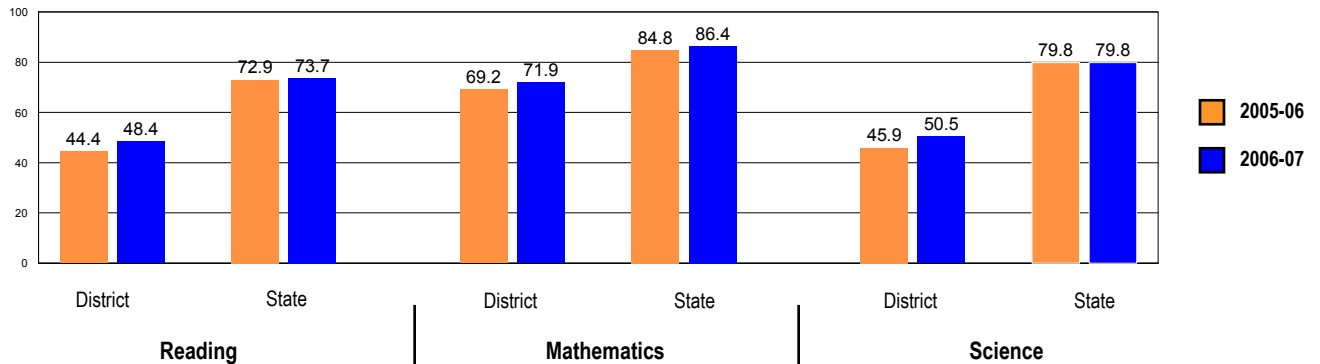

These charts provide information on attainment of the Illinois Learning Standards. They show the percents of student scores meeting or exceeding Standards for the grades and subjects tested on ISAT.

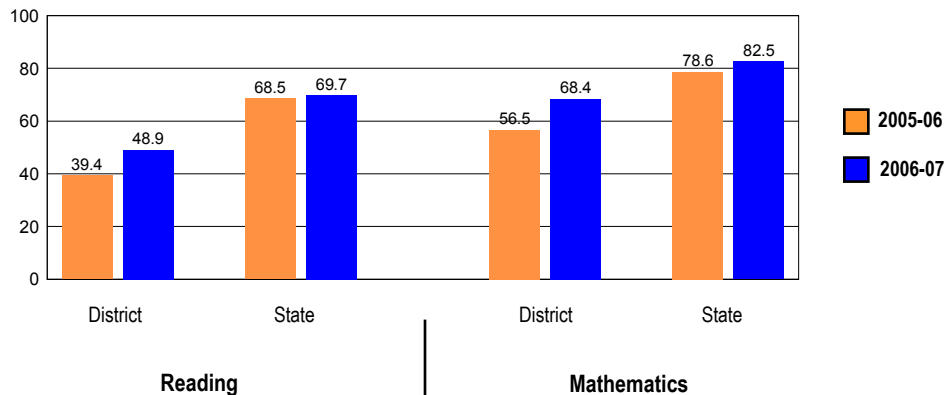

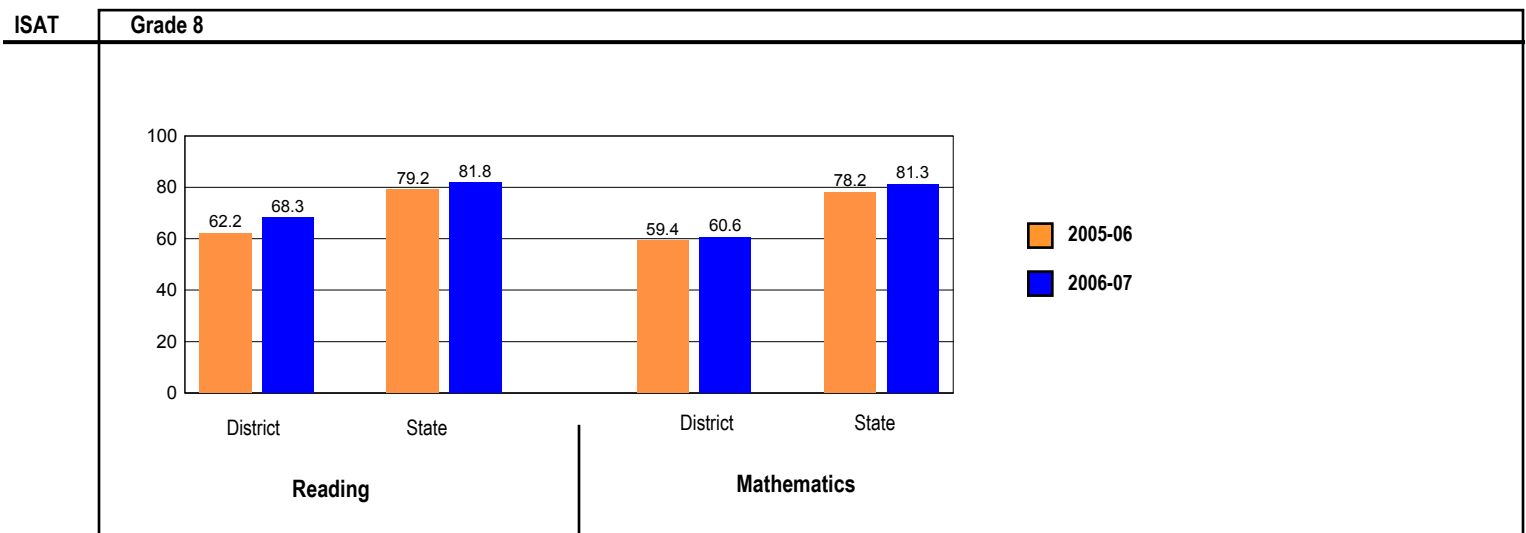
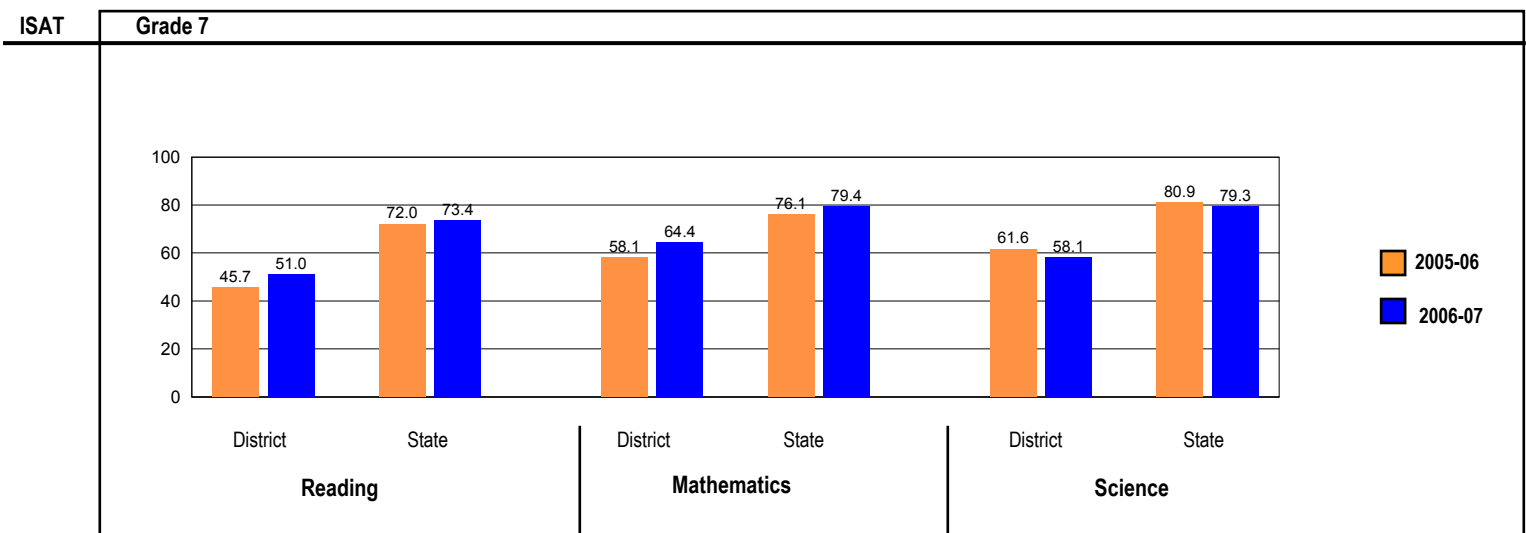
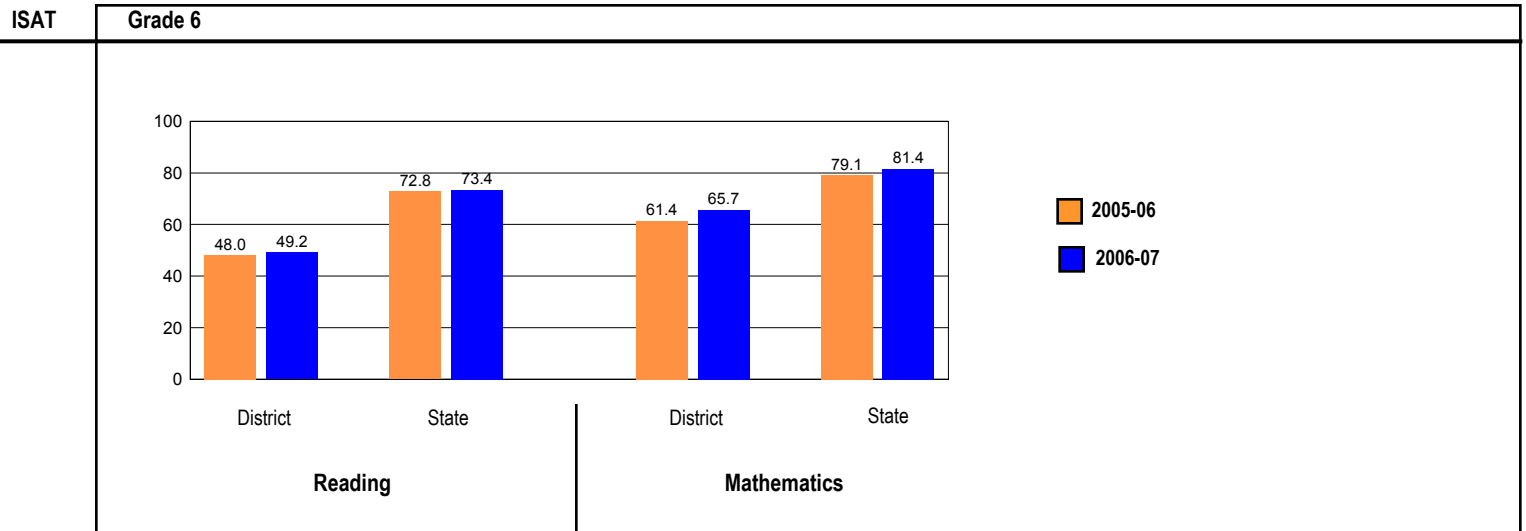


**ISAT Grade 4**

## PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for reading, mathematics and science for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3 through 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Measure of Annual Growth in English (IMAGE) is administered to limited-English-proficient students. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

### ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

- Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.
- Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.
- Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.
- Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.

## PLANNED IMPROVEMENT FOR THE DISTRICT

The 2007 ISAT test results indicated an increase in both Reading and Math. Fifty-five percent (55%) of the students met or exceeded standards in 2007 which was an increase from the forty-nine percent (49%) that met or exceeded the standards in 2006. Similarly, sixty-seven (67%) percent met or exceeded standards in math in 2007 compared to sixty-two (62%) percent of the students in 2006.

In 2006, we had seven (7) schools on No Child Left Behind status listed under Years in School Improvement; this year (2007) we have six (6) schools. We recognize and celebrate the academic gains and accomplishments achieved; the goal is to have all ten (10) schools make Adequate Yearly Progress in 2008.

We continue to focus on improving student instruction in the areas of literacy and mathematics through a collaborative process among teachers, administrators, central office staff, the Board of Education, the MEA, parents, and the community.

Administrators have developed SMART goals and objectives along with a plan of action to use as a guide for the year. Professional development in literacy is being provided for teachers, building level administrators, and central office administrators.

The number of Title I teachers has been increased this year to provide additional reading support for students in third through six grades in an effort to improve student achievement in reading. In addition, Family Reading Nights are planned throughout the year.

In an ongoing effort to increase student achievement in mathematics, District 89 will continue to work with the teachers and administrators in updating and refining the math curriculum maps to better service our students. Emphasis will be placed on developing common assessments generated for each grade level that will be administered to students every 6 – 8 weeks. Also, we will continue to provide professional development for teachers and administrators.

We have established a governance board and several parent advisory committees to give parents a vehicle to be a part of the educational process by assisting in the school improvement teams' planning objectives.

Our goal is to involve all stakeholders in a concentrated effort to address the status of our schools and our district. I know that working together in the best interest of our students will make a significant difference in the education and lives of the students and families we serve. "Whatever It Takes for Our Kids" is what we strive to do each day.
