# **Broadview Public Library Summer Reading Program READING BY DESIGN**

# Dear Parents / Caregivers:

The Broadview Public Library District invites children ages 2 - 17 to participate in our **Summer Reading Program**. Our 2017 theme is **Reading by Design**.

### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The goal of our 7-week Summer Reading Program is to promote literacy by encouraging children to read during the summer months and to engage youth in fun summer reading activities.

### **HOW TO PARTICIPATE**

- 1. Stop by Youth Services in the Broadview Public Library to sign up for the program.
- 2. Read books. (Children who are not reading yet may be read to by another child or adult.)
- 3. Keep track of the book titles and minutes read on a reading log (available in Youth Services) or a spiral notebook.
- 4. Earn a prize for every 100 minutes of reading time.
- 5. Visit the Broadview Public Library to share your reading log with an Instruction and Research Specialist in Youth Services to receive a prize for every 100 minutes of reading time.
- 6. Attend Summer Reading Program events (see reverse) and collect prizes along the way.

To encourage continued reading, it might be fun to help your child set a goal (ex. one book a night, one chapter book a week, etc.).

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## Who can participate in our youth Summer Reading Program?

Any child from ages 2 - 17 can participate in the *Reading by Design* Summer Reading Program at the Broadview Public Library District.

## When does the program begin / end?

The program begins Wednesday, June 14th and the finale will take place on Saturday, August 5th, with many fun events planned in between.

# Where will events take place?

All events will take place at the Broadview Public Library. (Check reverse side for event dates and times.)

## Do I need a Broadview Public Library card to participate?

No. You do not need a Broadview Public Library card to participate in the Summer Reading Program or the program events. You will need a library card to check out books. However, books can be read in the library without a library card.
