- What do you like about this artwork? What do you dislike about this artwork? Why do you think you feel that way?





Collect items with many different textures, such as leaves, flowers, or pinecones. Place each item under the paper, then use the side of the crayon to add the texture to




Use many different colors to create a fun composition!
