



# Jen Stark Drip Drawing


You will need:

- paper and pencil
- black marker or pen
- markers, colored pencils, or crayons

**Contrast** is an art principle that creates a strong, eye-catching change in an artwork, like when bold color is placed next to black and white.







- 1. Collect your supplies. You will need paper, pencil, black marker, and bright colored crayons, colored pencils, or markers.
- 2. Use a pencil to draw wavy lines that resemble dripping paint.
- 3. Trace your lines with a black marker.
- 4. Color in between the lines. Create **contrast** by leaving some areas of your drawing black and white.
- 5. Snap a photo of your artwork and share!
